
OKAY LOS COCHES INTERCHANGE

At longlast Glenview, where Los Coches Road comes into Old Hwy 80, is to get its access to the freeway, as told in a report from the Calif. Division of Highways.

They are calling for bids for ramps, grading for which was done in 1965. This will permit direct access between the Lakeside area, Glenview and Interstate 8. Bids will be opened in LA on Dec. 21, and if OK, work would start in 30 days, completion by spring of 1968.

Steamers could eliminate smog menace?

It is surprising to many to know that some 100 steam automobile fans silently sped to San Clemente last weekend for a conclave of the Steam Power Club. And they left no stinky fumes to pollute the once pristine fresh air of San Diego County.

All you heard was a swoosh-woosh. as the 50-year old cars, once kings of speed, concentrated on the beautiful



coast city for their get-together. As a boy I polished brass on the old Stanley and White steamers, once in a while got to ride in one, saw many of them on the highways.

Wayne Nutting of the club remarked that "one of these days if the public gets mad enough about the foul air it breathes, gas driven cars will be banned. Then Detroit will have to turn to steamers".

Members of this unique club, showing off their old steamers, believe this car will sooner or later stage a comeback, for they are silent, fast, have no transmission--just a throttle like a locomotive--are easy on fuel, kerosene which burns under the average 6-gallon boiler which reuses much of the steam. and they have more power and speed than gas cars, and of course practically no fumes.

Strangely enough the first "road wagon" was built by a Frenchman, in about 1770, and propelled by a steam engine mounted on the single front wheel, with 2 wheels aft over which the driver sat. Its speed was only $2\frac{1}{2}$ mph, and it had to stop about every 100' to regain pressure! In 1787 an American came out with a steam vehicle, as did others in England, but inventors soon developed the internal combustion powerplant which superceded the steamers.

The only other alternative to the pollution-making gas cars is the electric which is today being developed by several manufacturers. According to medical science and meteorologists, the entire world is today fast being enveloped in a death-dealing smoke-not fog, misnamed smog--which can take off thousands in a day!




SCHACHT TO BE ORDAINED

CARE OF THE BODY

HOLIDAY FRUIT BALLS

During the holidays most of us seem to get more than our share of sweets. One way to cut down on the consumption of commercial sugar is to substitute dried fruits. Here we offer a suggestion in the form of fruit balls made exclusively from natural foods.

We use unsulphured prunes, raisins, figs, (optional) apricots and dates, about $1\frac{7}{2}$ pounds, after seeds and stems have been removed. Put into food grinder along with one cup of shelled walnuts. Add 4 tbsp. orange juice, mix and let stand in refigerator several hours for easier handling. Then shape into balls the size of a large filbert and roll in ground coconut. Store in cans --- these fruit gems get more mellow with age -- - if you can keep them around that long.
