More 3-day holidays could save lives!

The Christmas holiday Monday, and the day off this coming Monday for New Year's Day, may well clinch the argument for making several national holidays uniform on Mondays.

Congress is now considering legislation that would change the living habits of the entire country, and it is getting a better chance of passage every day, especially since the administration abandoned its opposition.

Chief supporters of the move in Congress are Senate Minority Leader Everett M. Dirksen, R-Ill., Sen. Geo. A. Smathers, D-Fla., and Rep. Samuel S. Stratton, D-NY. Hearings have been in both divisions of Congress.

The bill would make Washington's borthday the third Monday in February; Memorial Day, last Monday in May; Independence Day, first Monday in July; Veterans' Day, last Monday in October, and Thanksgiving, fourth Monday in November.

As with Labor Day, this year's Christmas and New Year falling on Mondays, the public may well see and appreciate the idea of having other holidays on Mondays, allowing a full 3-day weekend, instead of breaking up the week by having them in mid-week.

When your editor published Let's Live Magazine in Hollywood he tried to get this idea over to President Roosevelt around 1933, even sent petitions in, but nothing happened. Sometimes it takes a long time for an idea to jell.

This plan, despite objections to traditionalists, could give the people more chance to drive safely to and from picnics, enjoy the outdoors more, and probably save lives, besides making the long weekend more pleasant.








HALF & HALF CHRISTMAS TREE



PEUTZ BRIDGE GOING UP

Here is an unusual view through heavy reinforcing steel stubs where the Peutz Valley bridge is being built for the new US8 freeway.

Looking west one sees through the bars another pier with its stubs. Both will be built up to support the span which will carry the 4-lane concrete road over Peutz Valley Road, and across the chasm.

The creek which flows through Alpine, turns north, enters a hugh 18foot culvert, which goes under the deep fill, now nearing completion, then empties into the old creekbottom and into El Capitan Reservoir below.

Oldtimers will remember how this creek ran all year, was used for swimming by members of a small nudist camp about half a mile down the valley.


