WHEN YOU SEE THINGS LIKE THIS---

Mr. & Mrs. Robt. Rix, South Grade Road, showed us an unusual letter from their son, SFC John Talamantes, from Korea where he was serving in the Army.

Some is well worth quoting: "I went to church again Sunday and we had some orphans in to sing. It's all I can do to keep from crying out loud. They look so lost for love. If I were a millionaire I'd take them all home. Little Danny, the cripple we take care of, is so loving. He's a 4-year old Korean with polio. He likes me a lot and it makes me feel good, too.

"What a mess. If people could see how well off they are, when you see things like this. Where we are is Camp Saber. The boy got his name from a medal-of-honor winner during the

Korean war right here. Cpl. Danny Saber gave his life so save his btry. from an attack, stayed on the machine gun firing while the btry. could get their big guns out. The little boy was found early last Feb. 1967 by the gate in the dark in the morning, with a paper clipped on him 'Take care of him, I can't written in Korean. So he was named Danny Saber. You should see him. He is so loving, and we keep him dressed nice. He's had two operations on his legs. The docs say maybe one more. He still wears braces. He speaks good English. . . He eats with us and the men take turns caring for him. They all love him. I wish I had him myself to take home. I guess he'll just grow up here with the Army, then leave some day. . . Tell everyone hello for me. God bless you all. Lots of love."

Perhaps we are too smug in our own prosperity? when we hear stories like the above. We do have rising taxes and livings costs going up, but in the main we live quite a contented life. We have many problems to overcome, but time will help and heal.

We think that John Talamantes, whom we have known since he was a little boy, has a very sensitive and sympathetic heart. We enjoyed reading this letter to his folks here in peaceful Alpine. -CL

DYERS ON EAST COUNTY FAIR

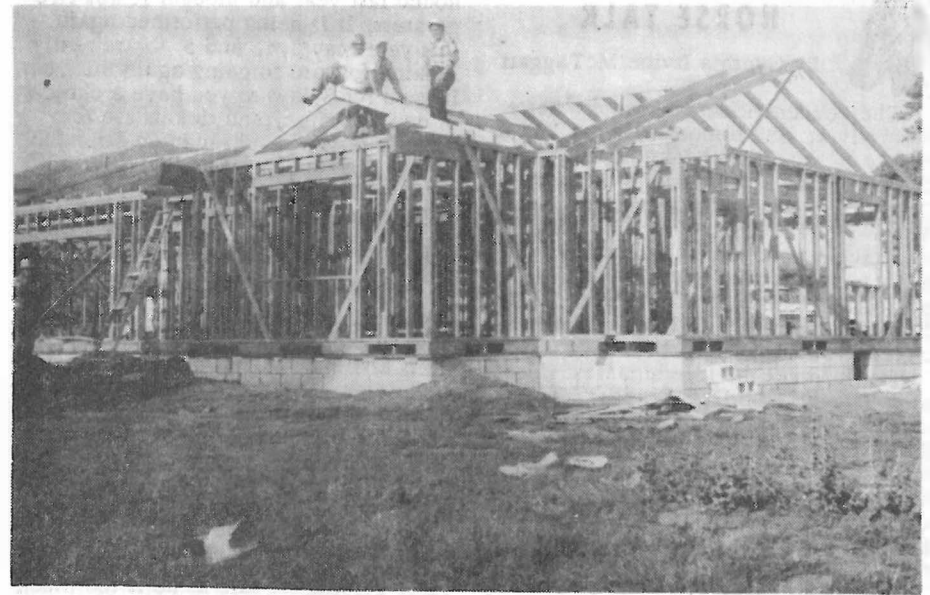

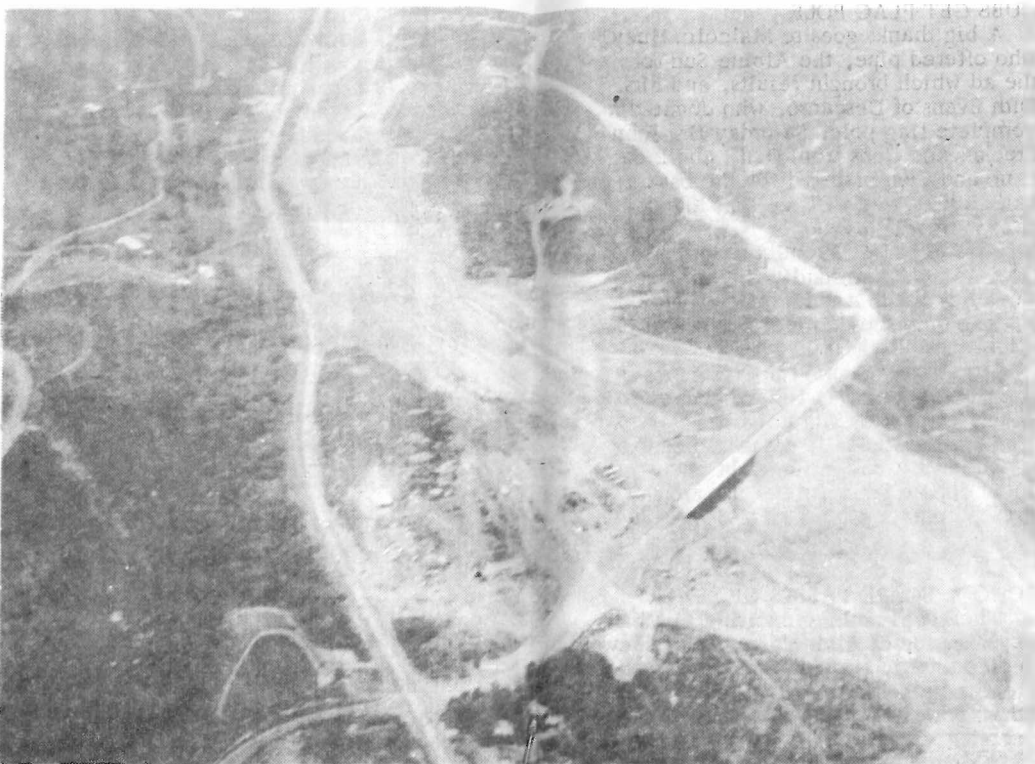

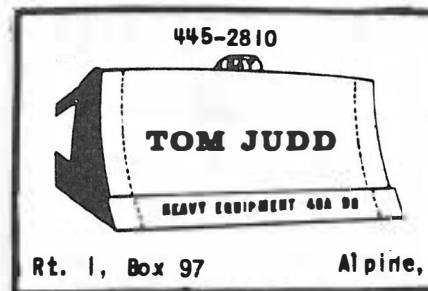
DOUBLE TALK CONTINUED
