# EDITORIAL

## OIL UP THE MOWER, IT'S WEED TIME AGAIN!

"Everyone benefits when weeds are destroyed before they can spread more seed", admonishes James. S. Moon, county agriculture commissioner, "because a constant battle is carried on against weeds by farmers, city, county and state highway departments, large industrial plants, and utility companies, and the cost is passed on to the consumer and taxpayer".

Earl Coke, state director of Agriculture adds that "weeds in California are a 1/2 billion crop we can't afford, so now's the time for homeowners to start control of this season's unwanted crop".

Moon adds that "most weeds are still immature and haven't gone to seed, so now's the time to start cleanup work. It will save time and money next year, as seeds that aren't allowed to form, can't

sprout".

Around Alpine there is a great crop, and it is feared that even now it is too late to destroy the seeds, but all should fill up the powermower and get busy.

Already the fire department has set the date of June 1 ahead to May 15, for open burning as the hazard is so bad and so early since the usual rains have not shown up.

Weeds, in addition to being unsightly, are fire and snake hazards and they compete for water with desirable ornamentals in landscaping. In addition, says Moon, weed control work now will aid in the general campaign to clean up SD County for the 200th Anniversary celebration in 1969.

And remember, be extra careful when you run the powermower--keep clear of the blades-- and see that children or animals are also kept at safe distances.

Yes, let's make Alpine cleaner and more beautiful!- CI.

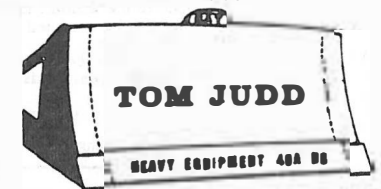

### HOW SOCIAL SECURITY AFFECTS YOU

The Sun presents this question and answer column about the Social Security Program as a public service. The questions are those most frequently asked. The answers are provided by Sumio Oto, El Cajon District Manager.

Q. I have lost my Social Security Card. How can I get another and how long will it take?

A. Contact your nearest office and ask for an application for a duplicate. You will receive your new card, with the same number, in about three weeks.

Q. My husband died 10 years ago. I am now 59. When can I apply for widow's benefits?

A. You should check with your social security office within three months before you reach 60. Reduced widow's benefits are payable at 60. If possible, you should take your marriage and birth certificates with you when you go to the office.
