ASSESS SCHOOL DISTRICT 50% UP

An increase of \$2,586,660, from \$5,169,530 for 1967-68 to \$7,756,190 for this year, topped the area for the Alpine Elementary School District, reports Gerald Lorengan, county auditor. This is a jump of 50.4%. The general county increase was only 8.8%.

SEEK BIDS ON NEXT FREEWAY JOB

Another 3 miles of US 8 freeway from Deadman's Curve, 6 miles east of W. Victoria Dr., and .4 mile east of Japatul Road at Hwy 80, is soon to start. Parallel bridges will be built to carry the 4-lanes with an added truck-climbing one eastbound.



NEW BAPTIST PASTOR

Here is the Rev. Patrick Caddell who recently took over as minister of the First Baptist Church of Alpine at Arnold Way and Tavern Road, with his wife Doris, and Mr. and Mrs. Robt. This will extend the freeway from SD to 9 miles east of Alpine for a total of 38 miles. The bridges will span the Sweetwater River for 600' with a Vista Point for eastbound traffic to overlook the river just west of the bridge.

Japatul Road will get an interchange northeast of Viejas Honor Camp. Completion is expected in the summer of 1970, reports Engineer Jacob Dekema. Cost is \$9,354,000, will have one of the highest embankments in the state, just west of the river. Bids are to be opened in LA on Aug. 22.

ALPINE RODEO EXCITEMENT GROWS

The first rodeo staged in Alpine is gaining more recognition as the time draws nearer with lots of entertainment and events planned for Aug. 3-4 week-end.

First is the Queen contest which is underway now, then Woodie Mitchell and Fred Williams are bringing a Champion Brahma Bull which will be on display in the center of Alpine. This bull has only been ridden three times in 3 years and no rider has ever won money on him. He weighs 2000 pounds, is named "Billie"

Saturday night after the evening performance a rodeo dance will be staged with live music at the YC and a barbecue will be on for the 2 days.

Chuck Smith, IRA president informed Williams and Mitchell last week that there would be 6 championship riders at the rodeo to compete for the 2nd largest IRA purse in So. Cal.

"Three performances will be staged for your convenience", says Woodie and if you don't like the heat, a night show will be staged Saturday, Aug. 3, starting at 8. Location is Alpine Youth Center and all the necessary lights, covered bleachers, etc., will be there.

Tickets may be bought from Irvine twins, 445-2394, two of the Queen contestants, or from Alpine C of C, Nikki's Apparle Shop or Alpine Western Wear.

Young Jamie Smith, son of the T. Aubrey Smiths of South Grade Road, is finishing up a course at the U of Oklahoma at Norman, in Pharmacy. EDITORIAL

WILL VIETNAM 'WAR' BE JOKE OF THE AGES?

While negotiators in Paris are pussy-footing around supposed to be seeking peace in Vietnam, hundreds of physically fit young Americans are being slaughtered in that faraway country in an undeclared war.

And the enemy is steadily blasting Saigon and the poor people of South Vietnam with rockets and mortars. We

have lost over 25,000 killed and many thousands wounded. Our allies have suffered also as have the South Vietnamese.

The administration keeps saying "have patience, it may take years!" Well, in only one more year of these asinine peace talks, we could lose over 400 dead and 2000 wounded weekly, or 20,000 killed and 100,000 wounded.

It seems that war brings dollars to many, both in high places, as the big corporations that sell munitions, food, uniforms, supplies and so on, and in low places, as the rats that infest the docks of Saigon where corruption rules from the top down.

It is indeed pitiable to contemplate that man can so easily get rich on the death and suffering of other men, women and children. We are not wholeheartedly in this conflict anyhow. No war has been declared. No president has said "Come, enlist, work, save, fight, we must win this war and win it as soon as possible!"

No wonder we have student riots, draftcard-burners, and rumblings underground about the war that nobody is really interested in. We have tackled a terrific job to reeducate the simple, backward South Vietnamese people who are apathetic and do not have the pep to build up their land. They have been in bondage for so many centuries that there is little left of them, and they are ridden by politicians and religionists till they hardly know which way to look for help.

Yes, this war is going to last a very long time, till we get in with the idea of winning. Till then, it's just another Korea!-CI

Lakeside member Ann Galle is reported to be ill at Ireton, Minn., where she has been visiting.



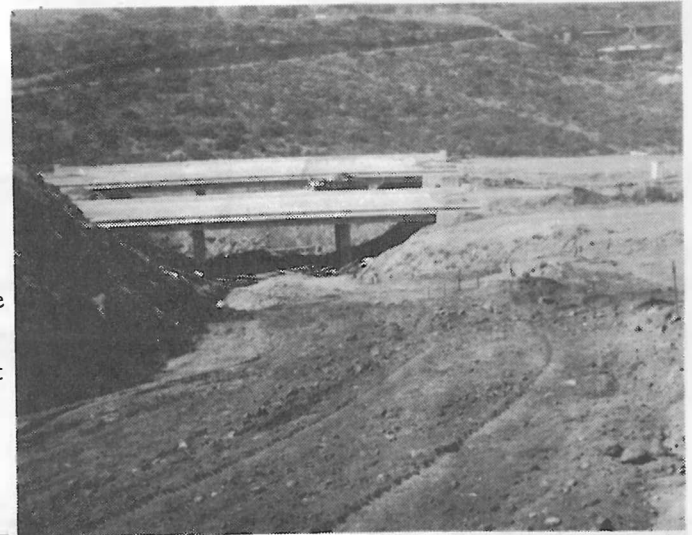
