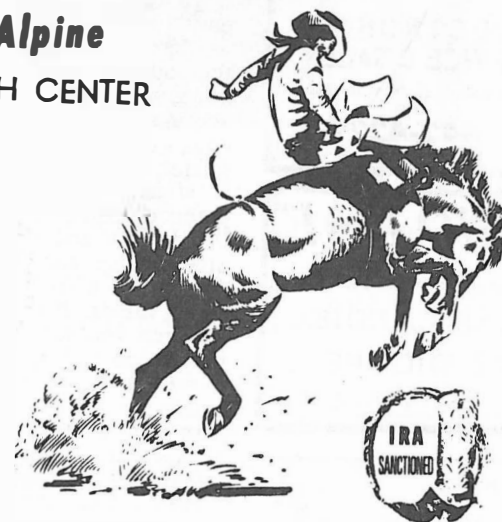

EDITORIAL

WAR CASUALTIES NOT ALL BATTLE CASUALTIES!

Last year in America over 3785 serious crimes were committed each day and the real tragedy of these figures is found in the rising number of youthful offenders. Arrests of boys and girls under 15 have increased 40% since the outbreak of the Vietnam war. The conflict in Asia is maiming and demoralizing not only our young men but American youth, as they turn to dope, take to stealing to support their habits, and this is foreclosing them against use-

ful adult lives.

This deplorable condition is depriving the nation in its future years of the trustworthy and capable type of American citizenship upon which its prosperity and progress will depend, and especially upon which its freedom will depend.

The solution is not in correction but with prevention and this means giving our children wholesome things with which to occupy their time, outside of school hours. Perhaps we should go back to the apprenticeship method of teaching and give them a chance to learn a trade and be more equipped to earn a living once through school.

Too much stress has been on giving the young the comforts parents didn't have, has made them unappreciative and unwilling to put in a good, hard days work, in other words, they are softies.

What peculiar trait of mentality produces crime in juveniles? Perhaps it is the TV and cinema which shows rape, sadism and murder with careless abandon to what it will do to their young minds. It has been proven that children who watch such violence display twice as much tendency to crime as those not exposed. Producers are making their shows more shocking than ever to sell more. There must be a reckoning, a change to more educational TV programs, movies, recreation facilities, if we are to protect our young Americans from false and undemocratic teachings and to preserve and promote the American way of life. -CI

READYING XMAS TOYS IN JULY

Alpine has one of the most unique projects for giving pleasure to youngsters down at San Felipe, Baja California. It is the work of Mrs. Morris Storm, of So. Grade Road, who is working day and night on hundreds of dolls to take down there at Christmas for the poor children.

"This is our third year" she told the Sun when this photo was being made in their living room, which is crowded with the dolls, "and will be the largest. At first we just bought a few toys to take down but when we saw the hundreds of kiddies with nothing we got the idea of taking presents for all, so now I work all year on this and it's a lot of fun".

She crochets clothes for the dolls sometimes till 1 a. m. fixes stockings with candy, fruit and toys, then Christmas week they are all loaded and trucked to Baja.

"We need boys' toys" she declares, "but dolls are the main item. We have many given us but we go to the Good Will and the Salvation Army and buy dozens. Many are filthy, so we scrub & disinfect them, dress them and store in plastic bags till Christmas. In 1967 we

took down 750 dolls!"

Gladys Storm is a sister of Lydia Campbell, whose husband is George Campbell, retired businessman of SD. They all go frequently to San Felipe for brief vacations and fishing and have made warm friends with the Mexicans there.

"Oh yes, we appreciate donations for this project" says Mrs. Storm, "almost anything, food, clothes, dolls, toys & so on".

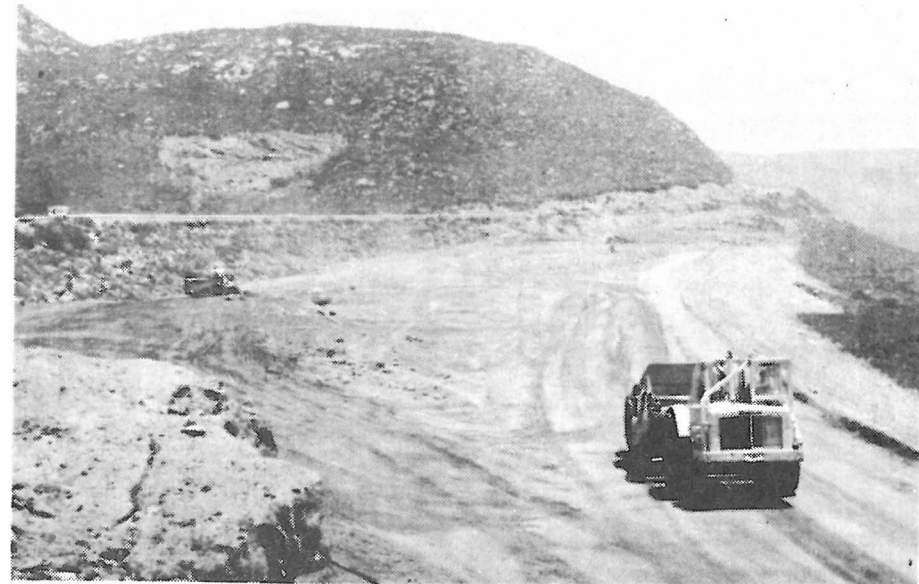

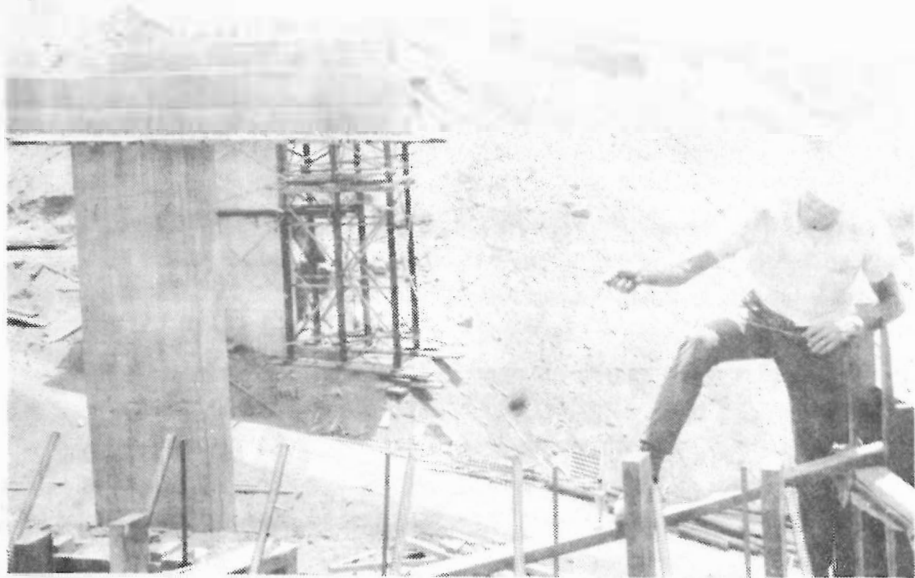

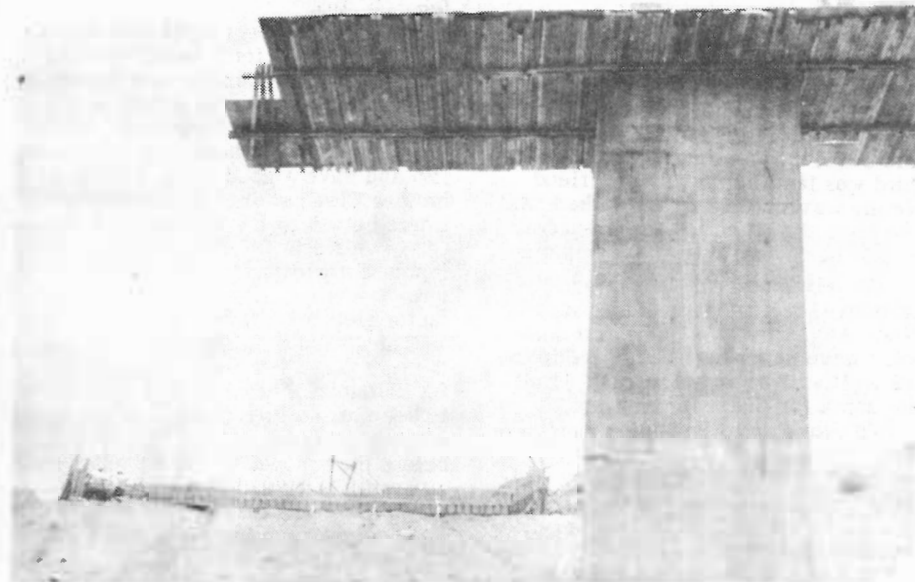
