The Sun office was visited Friday by County Assessor E.C. Williams left in photo, accompanied by his research analyst Henry Michael.

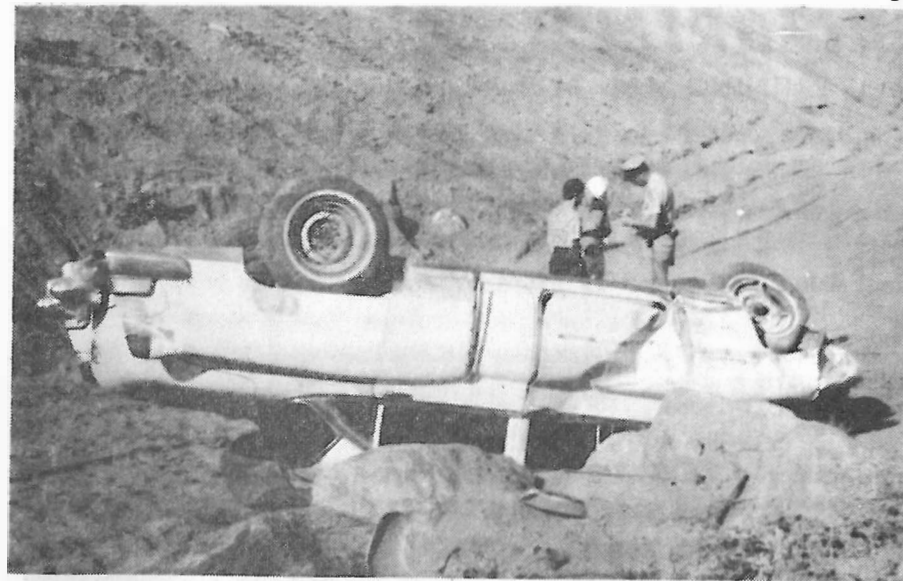


They are making periodical journeys to all parts of the county to keep abreast of progress, building and property values which enables them the better-- and fairer-- to assess land which is advancing in value all the time.

### KIWANIANS ENJOY PICNIC

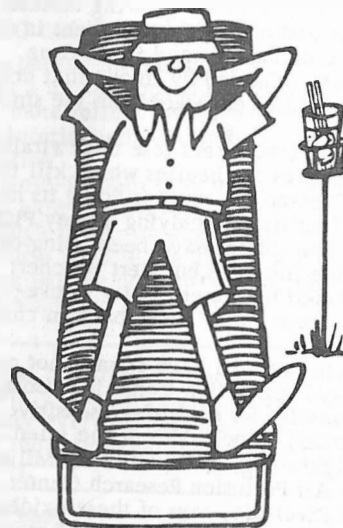

# EDITORIAL

## SMOG RUINING MAN AND VEGETATION

Two serious warnings have recently been published on the fast growing menace of city smoke--smog--plain air pollution, and most of it from auto exhausts.

Recently Editor Irvine flew over Alpine making photos of the freeway, and while returning to Gillespie Field was so struck with the "tide of smog" that he made this picture to show how the people in lower areas live in the "basin of pollution".

Smoke being difficult to photograph, this picture is not too clear, but it does show the horizon line on top of the smoke which lay over SD & EC, with a mountain top jutting up through the deep brown haze.

A ridge of hills in middle of photo is barely discernible, and ranches and roads in foreground, only about 1000 feet below, can barely be made out. A clear day is getting to be rather rare around SD.

Because growing air pollution has become a menacing health hazard, 60 medical scientists and professors, many



members of the UCLA medical faculty, are urging people to leave the smoggiest parts of LA, San Bernardino and Riverside counties. A number of families have left SD County for this reason.

The other warning was run in the SD Union: "Smog Lays Waste to Ponderosa Pines". It told of the growing diseases of pines and other beautiful trees in the LA, San Bernardino and Santa Cruz mountains. Caused by smoke that drifts 60 to 90 miles eastward from the smoky LA basin.

The stricken trees lose their vitality, become prey for beetles which kill them. Out of Fresno the smog is doing its havoc, and scientists are studying Torrey Pines Park. The studies have been going on since the mid 50's, but alert watchers have noted the onset of city smoke--mostly from autos--way back in the early 20's.

Soon man will have to save not only trees and vegetation from air poisoning, but himself, for he is more sensitive than trees! Conclusions of the scientists are frightening, and as Paul R. Miller, of the Air Pollution Research Center, UC at Riverside, says of these oxidants, "Man has created the poisonous atmosphere which is killing the pines, and until we can persuade the automobile

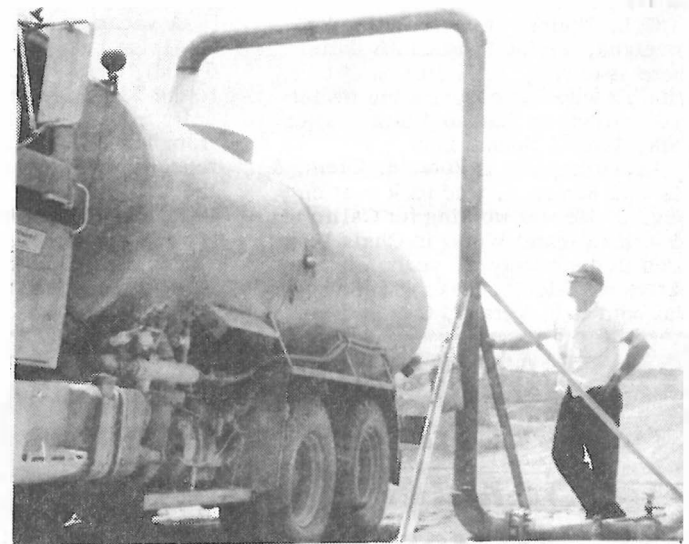

## NEW SOLAR STILL IDEA HAS BRIGHT FUTURE

While many water-heating appliances are being used in sun-drenched areas, utilizing the intense rays of the sun, a new idea is being developed here, a solar still to yield fresh, pure distilled water. It is the invention of a 46-year old SD man, Horace W. McCracken, who recently quit his job with an aeronautics firm to devote all his time to it. One of his unique stills, a domestic size yielding an average of 5 gallons a week, is now in use on the Irvine Ranch here, the pure water being used for drinking, domestic, photography and printing. Distilling water

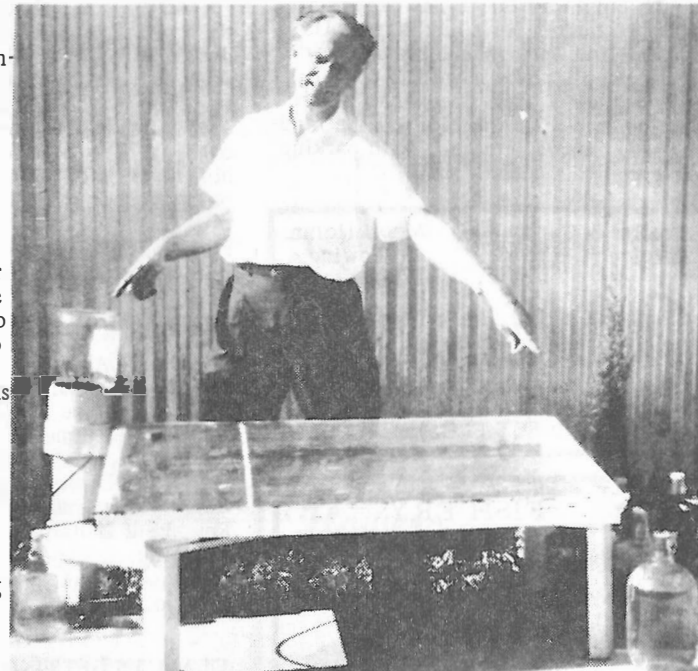
costs up to \$1.40 for 5 gallons. This costs nothing, only the task of putting 1½ gallons of city water in each morning and taking off the distilled water.

"We know we have a bright future" McCracken says "as people are vitally interested and we are now producing all we can deliver and are planning on upping production at once".

McCracken, a soft-spoken, intellectual type of fellow is deeply interested in science, puts all his time into improving the unique solar still. He has two hotels down at Mulege, and 3 homes in Puertecitos, Baja, that have been producing pure water for some time. He now has over 40 units in operation, largest a 20-gallon-a-day one at Ballarat, near Death Valley, for a trailer park.

"My interest in this began in April, 1956" McCracken states, "while administrative assistant to the director of research, Consolidated Paper, in Quebec. It just occurred to me that there ought to be a way to use solar energy to do this job, so I thought up a system which works and have been deeply interested ever since".

He has stills working efficiently in addition to Alpine, in El Cajon, La Mesa, SD, La Jolla, Vista, Carlsbad,



and an experimental one in Santee. He has had enquiries from afar since the stories have been published recently.

There are two types, the manual where one pours in an excess of the capacity-- for overflow-- then removes the pure water at day's end, and the automatic, which is done by mechanical means.

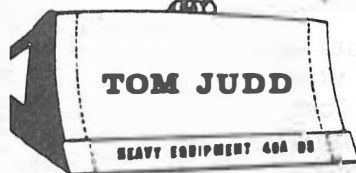
