SELLOUT SEEN FOR RANCHO ARBOLES

If you doubt that Alpine and the back country is not moving ahead with San Diego, and that the freeway is going to leave these areas out, you better think again and take a good look at what is transpiring.

Currently Alpine is gaining for a substantial increase in population with the Pierce development of 200 homes, the 151 spaces for Vista Alpine Motel home Estates by the Sickles plan, and now the 700-acre high class 2½ to 5-acre and a few larger, home-sites of Rancho de los Arboles, on Japatul Road only 2½ miles from the Japatul interchange on US 8, soon to be built. 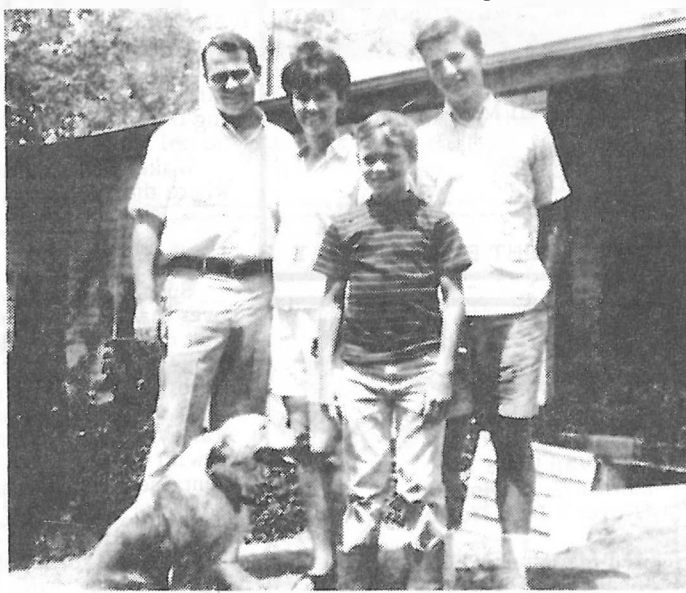
The whole family loves it out here, and with many prospects already seeking out prime sites-- the project is 10% sold out already and the grand opening is still 3 months away! -- the Byers, exclusive sales agent, and the boys, ride motorbikes, jeeps and drive cars around the dusty roads which are now being paved. They really have a ball.

Byers is a native of Tucson while Betsy was born in Pasadena, lived there most of her life, but is now a confirmed Alpiner, the rancho being only about 9 miles from downtown Alpine

FREWAY JOB TO PHOENIX FIRM

The third stretch of US 8, 3 miles, from Willows Road Interchange (Deadman's Curve) to Japatul Road at the Sweetwater bridge west of Descanso, was low bid by the Morrison-Knudsen Co. of Phoenix, reports Dist. Engineer Jacob Dekema.

Their figure was \$7,823,294, or per mile \$2,607,764, includes the 4-lane freeway on new alignment with an additional truck-climbing lane. The eastbound truck-climbing lane will go an



added 3.7 miles westerly along the 4-lane freeway now being built.

Also 2 parallel 600' bridges will cross the Sweetwater and a Vista Point for eastbounders will overlook the river west of the bridge. An interchange will be built for Japatul Road which will lead off to Viejas Honor Camp, the new Rancho Arboles subdivision, and other properties south to Barrett areas.

Work is expected to last till the summer of 1970. It will eliminate all those bad curves, will include one of the tal-

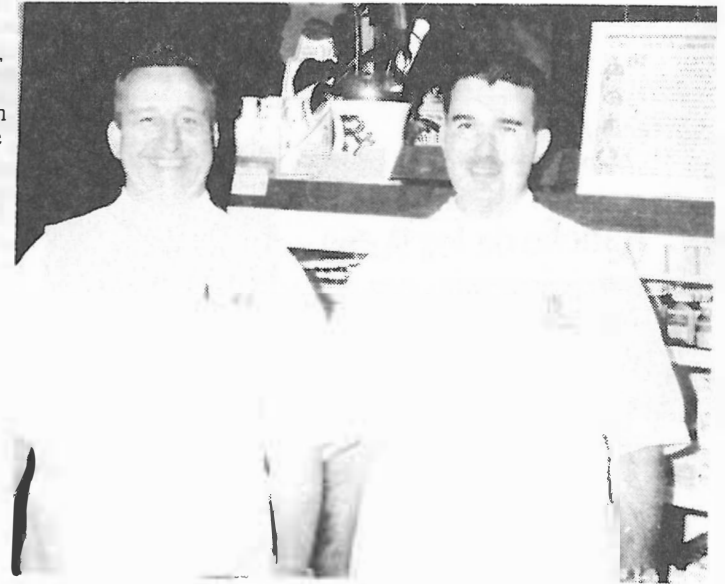


ALPINE BOY MAKES GOOD AS PHARMACIST

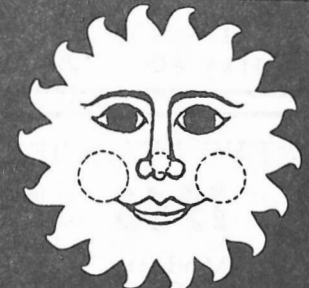

MORE ON SOCIAL SECURITY

From the EC district office, this answer comes to a woman's query: "Who can qualify for a disabled widow's benefits under the recent changes in the law?"

A. A severely disabled widow between 50 and 62 may qualify if her disability began before her husband's death or within 7 years after. The husband must have worked long enough under social security to qualify for benefits.

Q. How many people are covered by the Medicare program?

A. Practically all of the 19½ million 65 and over in the US are eligible for hospital insurance, and 18½ million have signed for the voluntary medical insurance program.

Another item that was passed was an indoor drinking fountain refrigerated, for use of the firemen when they return from a fire and need a cool drink.

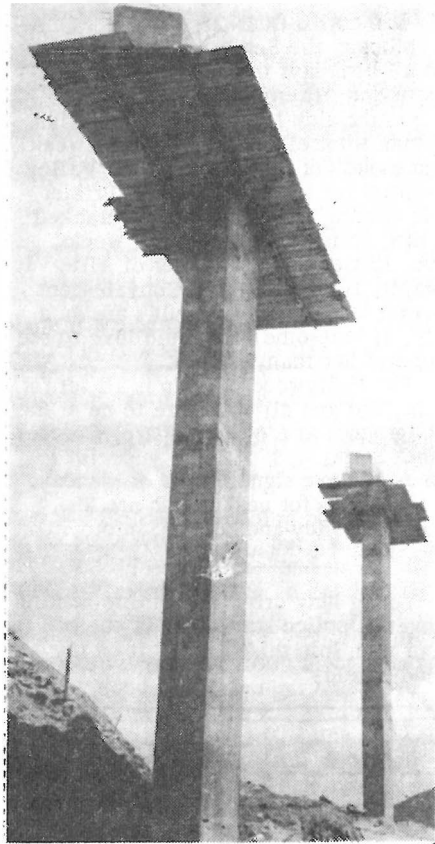

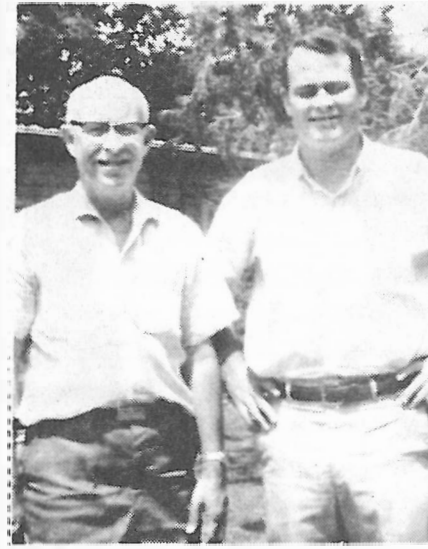
