EDITORIAL

ELECTRICITY, A GOOD FRIEND, MIGHT KILL!

We all know that the versatility and wide use of electricity today is one of the marvels of the Twentieth Century. It is a warm friend, warm in many ways-- heating, cooking, bed-warmers and so on-- yet it can be a deadly "hot" friend if not handled with care.

Too many housewives and children, even men, take this mysterious power for granted. Many handle it carelessly,

even though warnings are printed on some appliances and the story of damage, fire and injury-- even death-- have been widely publicized.

For example, in only five weeks, four county residents were electrocuted. Needless, too. A man of 62 forgot to turn off the current to a kitchen exhaust fan while installing a fan in the attic. It killed him.

Next day a Navy man, only 23, was found dead in the bathtub. He had set a lamp on the tub to read by. It tumbled into the water, killing him. Girls will often stand a radio on the tub while indulging in a bubble bath. This is hazardous, too.

Only two weeks later a 5-year old went into his garage in wet trunks, started an electric drill. Likewise he was electrocuted.

While vacuuming, a housewife, 64, reached with a wet hand for the metal stand of a floorlamp. The machine, an old one, apparently shorted, and the poor woman was found dead.

Good friend Electricity is only as safe as we make it. If you feel a mild shock while handling any appliance, your range, or heater, call the SDG&E trouble man who will gladly come out and inspect the appliance.

Simple toasters, radios, TV-- anything run by electricity-- are often involved in such accidents. If your man in the house understands it, he may make repairs, otherwise get an expert who has been trained for such jobs.

Remember, above all, that electricity and water (even the earth) are good friends, so never be a go-between, your friend might kill you!-CI

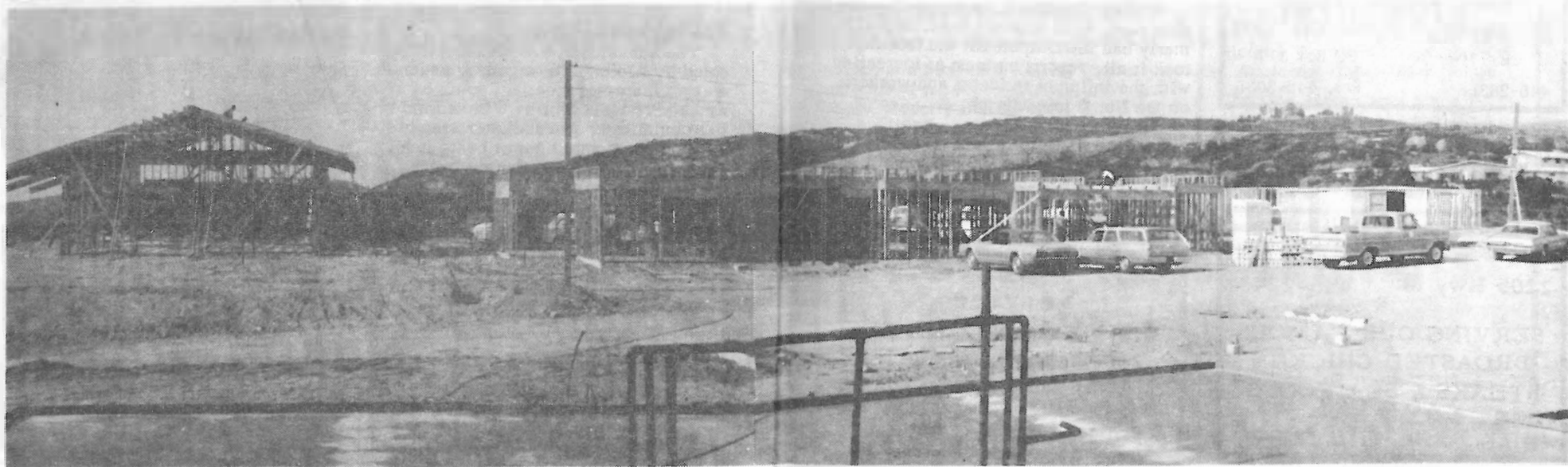

DATE LOOMS NEAR

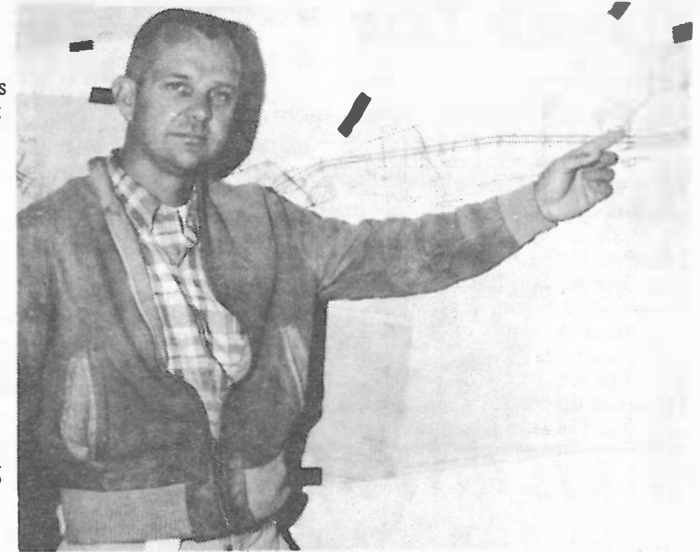
