



He lived long enough to see many of his ideas become law, ideas for the good of the underdog, the working man, the people, that have made our country a better place in which to live.

The present war on poverty is not new, for Sinclair had that plan some 30 years ago. Many will remember his Utopia plan when he ran for governer here. I was on his committee in LA, worked hard for it, but like other legislation, the opposition scared the little people so they voted it down. (See editorial last issue).

When the author was but 28 his greatest book "The Jungle", came out. In that novel he exposed the deplorable conditions in the Chicago stockyards. Shortly after Congress passed the Pure Food & Drugs Act. It is still protecting the American public.

He went out after big business as a Socialist, and he aroused the public so much that the vested interests could not defeat his inspired legislation. If you want to enlighten yourself, read his startling book "The Money-changers", and "The Brass Check", or "Damaged Goods". And if you want to know how depressions happen, read "Upton Sinclair presents Wm. Fox". This book he presented to me. It tells how the Morgan big business octopus made the 1907 panic and others.

Yes, Sinclair started the move, very modern today but modern back in 1906, with Dr. Sylvester Graham, to protect the public from fraud. He was a living example of the old saying "The pen is mightier than the sword". -CI







Here Smith is shown at right, with salesman, Archie Frogge, who lives nearby, keeps the office open most of the time.





WOMAN'S CLUB PLANS PARTY




