When Interstate 8 began to shape up a lot of people started thinking that Alpine would become a ghosttown.

But this menace proved to be a blessing in disguise, for now that it has

been in operation since March 16, residents and businessmen have found that removing heavy traffic from Hwy 80, made the thoroughfare a real small town business street known as Alpine Blvd.

Sunday it proved that point, for the freeway relieved us of that thundering herd of homecoming motorists that used to prevent one's crossing Hwy 80 to go to church or to a store, or go from north to south and back.

Yes, freeways are wonderful, but we still have the threat of air pollution from gas-driven cars and trucks. Wouldn't it be an ironic joke after we have spent millions on freeways, if we all died off in a few years from emphysema and other respiratory diseases which the smog is charged with produc-






#### HORSE TALK





#### COMMUNITY IS UNIQUE IN PEOPLE AND HISTORY By Marilyn Lee

Alpine is a modern town with a pioneer personality. It is only 15 minutes from El Cajon, 25 from San Diego, but it is miles removed from city pace. The people here are sturdy and serene; they hurry not and they smile a lot. They live free and they love the outdoors, Here there is more outdoors.

Alpine's 4500 citizens are hikers and horsemen, ranchers and hobbyists, retired and youthful adventurers, who find in Alpine a chance to relive a leisurely chapter out of early California. Here is their mountain mecca. Rugged beauty. Fresh air, Open spaces. And history in every dell and glen.

For there is a tridition here that wherever you find an oak tree or a stream, you find relics of Alpine's first natives, The Kummee-is Indians, whose descendants dwell on nearby Viejas Reservation. And in the heart of town stand memories of pioneer-settler days, the Alpine Tavern house, which burned some years ago, and the Library, replete with rococo, echos of when Alpine was a lively stop on the stage-coach route to the mines of Julian.

Alpine is historic but not provincial. It is growing. A 151-unit mobile estates opens next week, 3 new tracts of ranches are underway, Sleepy Hollow and Shady Rock will accommodate many summer campers. The annual Viejas Days Horse Show drew over 1500 entries this year from as far as Phoenix.

The town's newspaper, the Alpine Sun, billed as "America's smallest newspaper' is now large enough to be read throughout the county. A forward-gazing chamber of commerce, 75 ro.

bust businessmen and 20 civic clubs, keep Alpine peaceful but progressive, as steady as its 78 degree year-round climate.

With its solgan "Best Climate in the US by Gov't report", the town is known nation-wide for its salubrious weather, all year round, which affords almost instant relief for those with respiratory troubles. Many thrive here when they would only exist elsewhere.

But most of all, Alpine is a town of interesting people. Roger Craig, Dodger's pitcher winning two World Series, now coaching the Padres; Jim and Mildred Rorie who manufacture fibreglass animals, standing 21 feet tall; Dr. Frank Bornowski, blind chiropractor and ham radioist; Bea LaForce, playright; Helen Ellsberg, photojournalist, and many, many more happy residents.

It is best summed up by one of Alpine's leading citizens, age 80, who hikes 5 miles a day, raises horses, carves his own furniture, and flies an airplane:

"We have room to pioneer here,"



your wonderful climate. Your weather is great, but your rocks are sure hard".

Mohr refers to the 2 million pounds of ammonium nitrate used to blast through hills of solid blue granite between Tavern and Willows Roads, which was so neatly done by Daley that it has become a scenic spot.

Says Mohr: "We also used 4 million cubic yards of materials and totalled 900,000 man-days of work over a 2-year period. Most effective was the use of a combined seed-fertilizer-affixative on the freeway slopes for beauty and to prevent soil-erosion."

Legislation is now pending in the Public Works Office to use non-operating rights of way for mini-parks and commercial enterprises, which will offer Alpine an added bonus to its already modern freeway system.
