EDITORIAL



SCIENTIST'S ASTOUNDING DREAM WORKS FOR US.

Perhaps only a few of the millions who enjoyed the splashdown of Apollo 10 off Samoa in those limpid waters of the South Pacific, realized that what they saw on TV was the result of the dream of John R. Pierce, communications scientist at the American Tele phone & Telegraph firm's Bell Labora tories.

His dream was sparked by a British science writer, Arthur Clarke, who, in 1945 wrote in Wireless World about ex traterrestrial relays. Thus he was the first to propose communication satel lites which led up to the present miracle a dreamer, later wrote some science Telstar.

Way back then, before the space age began, Clarke envisioned the three stationary satellites circling 22, 300 miles aloft to cover the entire earth with radio, TV and phone messages, which we use today and think little of it.

Thus we were able to enjoy the Apollo drama, and many other events around

the globe instantaneously via the three circling objects. Echo was the first, a mylar balloon inflated by gas after being fired by rocket. Today the three are working every minute to serve mankind.

As radio waves will not go through land, as the earth's curvature, the satellite receives the transmission, reflects or echoes it back to another station on the ground. So with three such space stations, transmission may circle the globe in seconds.

Pierce, raised in California, was an enthused reader of H.G. Wells, himself fiction to help pay his tuition. He was an outstanding student all along, and gifted with perspicacity in science.

Three years before Sputnik, in 1954, he proposed the first communication satellite, the 100-foot balloon of aluminum foil, to ride at a 1000-mile altitude. President Eisenhower's voice inaugurated its history-making flight. Today we use the idea with little thought of its inception.

Pierce believes that "we are living in the most exciting age of man's history, but that not enough people are watching".

You may see Echo, resembling a star, if you scan the western sky after sunset, for the slowly moving, dying satellite, is nearing its demise in earth's atmosphere. We have seen it.

If you want to read this astonishing story, and many others on the magic of the space age, including a special report on UFO's, see "America's Explorers of Space", by Donald W. Cox, superbly illustrated, published 1967 by Hammond, Maplewood, N.J. It will help you understand the untold value of spending billions on space projects. CI





LOCAL ARTIST'S FAMOUS AVIATION
MURIAL GOES TO SMITHSONIAN

In a note to the Sun Justin C. Gruelle, noted painter of Lilac Lane, writes: 'Dear Clarke:- The enclosed page from the Aeronautical Review of Dec. 1955 will look familiar to you as you ran a cut of the mural in the Sun shortly after Mabel and I moved to Alpine.

"We have some current news about the painting that you may find of interest as both an art and aeronatuical item. The mural has been given to the National Air and Space Museum, Smithsonian Institution, Washington, D.C. It is the gift of Clarence A. de Giers, for whom it was originally painted, and the I. A.S. now called the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics.

"When the A.I. A.A. notified the industry, last year, that they planned to sell their building in L.A., the directors of the National Air Space Museum put in a request for the painting. The transfer of ownership was made and the canvas, 18' by 8', was removed



from the wall and shipped to the Smithsonian in April.

"As you may know, the NA-SM has been occupying one of the Smithsonian buildings and were only able to display a very small portion of their huge and wonderful collection. They have long needed an adequate museum building.

"Congress passed the necessary legislation for this during the last administration and the architectural design has been completed. However, congress may not give the green light for build-

ing to begin until the war is ended. In the interim the painting will be on display in the present quarters.

"I know how you love to fly so I am sure you will be delighted that a national museum devoted to the history of man's conquest of air and space is finally taking shape in the nation's capital."

deGiers is founder of the Liquidometer Corp., and an aviation pioneer, learning to fly a Bleriot single-seater, without benefit of a co-pilot! He holds FAI license #77; founded his company after WW1. Gruelle painted the mural in 1940 while residing in Silvermine, Conn.

Thanks so much, and all Alpine will be glad to know that one of its dedicated painters executed that most interesting and beautiful mural which many pilot, and resident of Alpine, will surely wish to see. CI




