The nine directors were on hand at the opening. Barnes owns the famous Manzanita apple ranch in Julian.

"These directors serve without pay" Barnes told me, "because they are interested in the Exposition and the job is a challenge representing big opportunity to be of service to the community".

They do not try to make a profit, just break even, and do not levy taxes, but do get revenue from the 42-day horse racing season there.



He is attending Linda Vista Bible Seminary in EC, will report the Canyon Church's activities from now on in the Sun, is currently working on a big revival for month's end.








SLEEPY HOLLOW COMES AWAKE!




LAST ISSUE ALL SOLD OUT!



OLD WEST MOTEL IS BIG HIT






