

EDITORIAL

SCHOOL BUS CONTRACT UNFORTUNATE AFFAIR,

It is unthinkable that our fine school board, made up of dedicated citizens who serve without pay and but trivial thanks, should be the target of suspicion, innuendos, and gossip because they awarded the 5-year transportation contract to the Patchett firm.

Supt. Paul Clay resigned in June, effective Aug. 15, to take a post with "a company up north", which was later revealed to be Patchett.

As Judge Hugo Fisher pointed out at

the hearing, the board was not charged with any fraud or misconduct; the law gives them the right to act as they did. (See Sept. 12 Sun).

However, Clay came here from Newman, Calif., where Patchett was based and he was school superintendent. He then suggested to the board that they abandon owning buses and Patchett got a 5-year contract.

The affair has been aired in area newspapers, but Clay is hard to find "in" on long distance. The Aztec complaint also alleges that representatives of Patchett, while visiting here, stayed in the Clay home.

Judge Fisher set next Friday at 10 a.m. for hearing the amended complaint, which to Wednesday, had not been filed, but must be by today, that is, if Aztec decides to go ahead.

It has been pointed out that the law gives the board latitude only, as license to do what they wish regardless of the usual lowest bidder getting the contract. This they did, very probably with the enthusiastic suggestion of Clay. Apparently Patchett rendered good service, so was awarded the contract although Aztec was lowest.

It might be observed that, if the contract were switched to Aztec they might not have too pleasant a time of it.

Perhaps the whole mess rightfully should be turned over to the grand jury for complete investigation at public cost, rather than at private expense. It is too bad we could not keep the money here instead of "up north".-CI.



By The Double C's



BUS STORY FROM PAGE 1

Aztec filed a suit against the school board. At the preliminary hearing the court granted the bus line a 10-day delay. Within this time they must file an amendment to satisfy a legal requirement pointed out by the presiding Superior Court Judge, Hugo Fisher. The trial date was set for Oct. 10.

It was established that a school board is in itself a court with limited jurisdiction. Judge Fisher indicated that "to upset the ruling of a governing board is a serious matter."

Discretion to award a bid of this nature to the lowest responsible bidder is placed completely in the hands of the board by the education code. However, there are no standards defining responsibility in the code. Therefore interpretation of the relevant sections of the code as well as motives of the board will be the issues decided at the time of the trial.

The plaintiffs charged the board with "abuse of this discretion" and that this abuse was directly connected with the former superintendent Paul Clay and his relationship with the Patchett line. The references made to Clay being employed by Patchett were so frequent and unchallenged that it seems no longer a matter for speculation. (See editorial).
