GEO. KOCHER TO BE EAGLE SCOUT

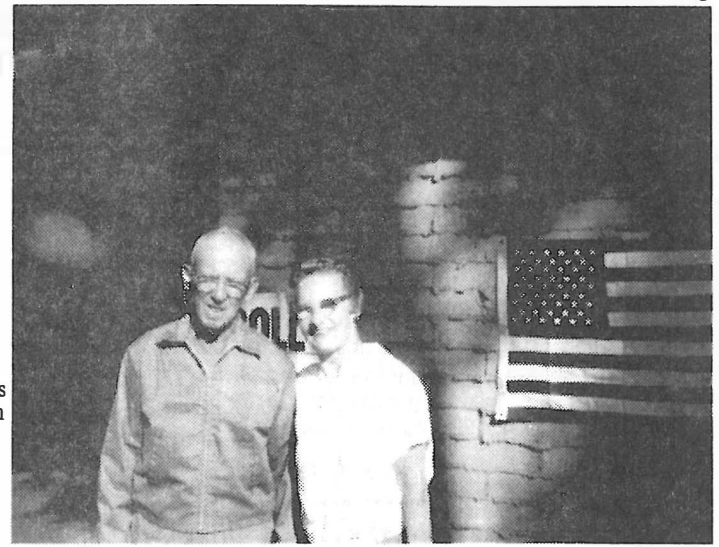

ALPINE SEWER PROBLEM AGAIN IN PUBLIC EYE!

Now they are probing the legality of the recent \$580,000 bond election for hooking into Lakeside's system, which failed on Oct. 28.

County supervisors are investigating the election which failed as less than 110 voters favored it. Two-thirds are necessary, of the electorate, and they were not received, the tally being 100 yes, 55 no.

Supervisors sit as directors of the local district, ordered county counsel Bertram McLees, jr., to investigate after learning that the election code was not followed.

Thorsnes, representing Alpiners Frank O'Neill and Mrs. Auren Pierce who said they were refused permission to check the voter list to see who had not balloted so they might have contacted them to get the vote out.

Thorsnes said this violated Sec. 14218, submitted a letter from Chas. Sexton, registrar of voters, saying they were not allowed to see the roster as allowed by code. The attorney asked the board not to certify the poll, which would mean that another election could not be held for six months, also asking that the recent one be declared void.

This puts Alpine in a bad position for the water quality office has ordered the district to stop discharging effluent into Alpine Creek which flows some 5 miles down to El Capitan reservoir. This must stop by Jan. 1.

County engineers have recommended the hookup to Lakeside-- ultimately to the metropolitan system-- and there has been much argument for both sides, the "noes" wanting to go the Dehesa route without having to pump sewage over Chocolate summit.

This is a pressing problem which, although only 300 may vote in the district, affects all Alpine, and its future progress, unless some kind of sanitary district can take care of it all. Thus building in downtown comes to a stop, and little progress can be made in outlying sections as Tavern and South Grade Roads, Victoria area and other environs.

An efficient sewer plant should not smell, but this one does! -CI

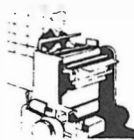

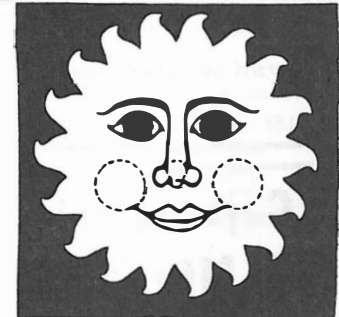

In Washington FDA Commissioner H.L. Ley, jr., reports that a government advisory panel says the benefits from oral contraceptives still outweigh the risks, despite new proof of blood clot danger and complications.

"There is no effective drug on the market" said Ley, "that doesn't have serious adverse side effects".

A N. Y. doctor states that cancer, diabetes and high blood pressure are evidenced following use of the pill. Pill users are said to be 3% more likely to die between 15 and 44 than women who use other birth control means. Clots can be fatal when they lodge in heart, brain or lungs.

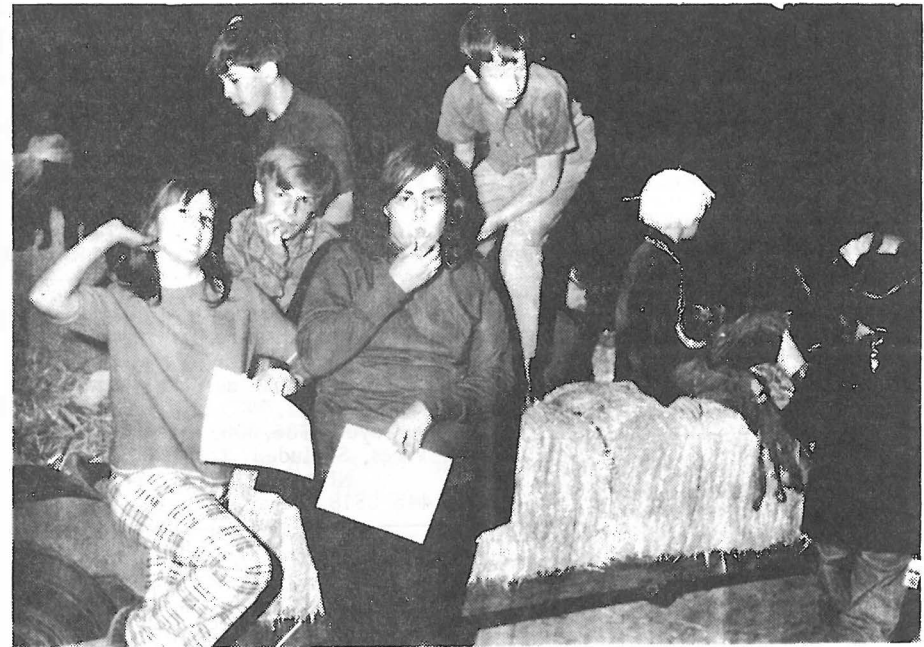

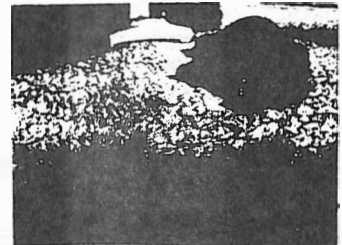
