One of every 50 cars approaching you will be piloted by a drunken driver-not drinking, but plain drunk. People often ask me, a pilot of light air-planes, "arn't you afraid up there in the air?"

No, not a bit, for when you drive a car, there are some 1500 or more per hour coming at you on a collision course. While in the air we seldom even see another plane! I feel much safer up in the air than on any high-

way. With New Year's Eve only a few days away, it behooves us all to drive extra carefully, and control ourselves behind the wheel. Never let anger, impatience or discourtesy affect your driving. Go defensively. Give that right-of-way to whoever must have it. Be patient; be safe and stay alive. -CI




WESTERN WEAR KEPT 3 BUSY






