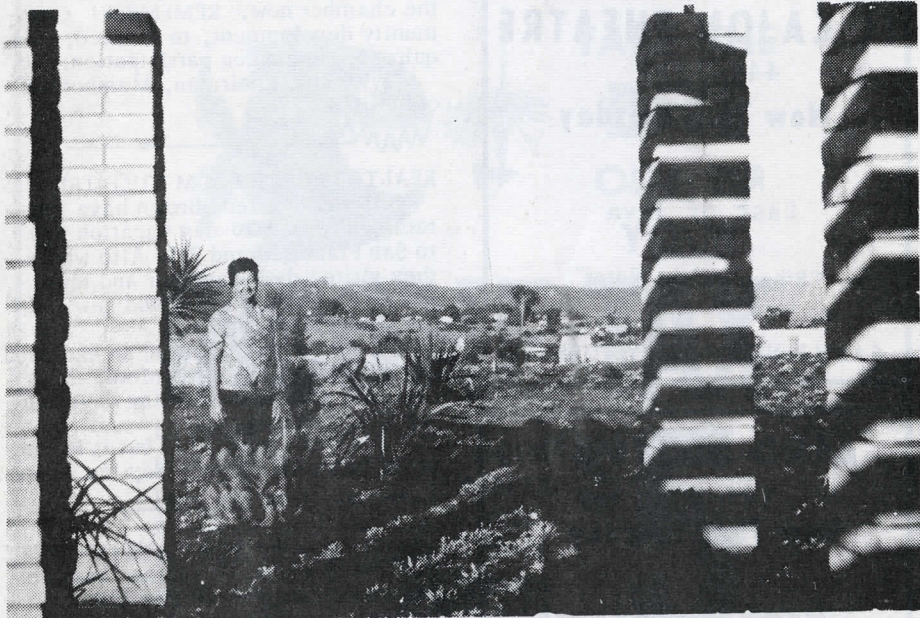
### WILCOX SELLS PARCEL

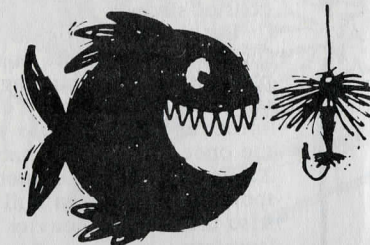
### FORDNEY'S ENJOY HOLIDAY REUNION

Only last month the director of public health, Dr. J. B. Askew ran a story in the bulletin from his office on how the public resents dirty air.

"Calls protesting air pollution have more than doubled since July. Smoke emissions have been reported from construction and other industrial sources", he wrote.

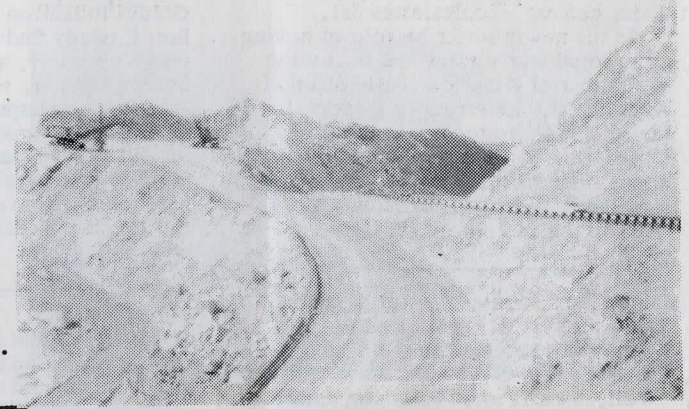
