Later Sue Anne Rose, 9, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Robt. R. Rose found the body of the little dog, called Mrs. Kimball, who identified the tags as the animal had drowned in a flume two blocks off Hwy 94 near Dulzura where the Roses live.

"Oh, we do not want any reward" Mrs. Rose said, "but Mrs. Kimball told her to take the money and use it for the little girl.

It was at first thought that Spunky had become lost when Mrs. Kimball's son Ken was out target shooting, but they now believe she just got frightened at the noise and tried to go home.

Note- The distracted owner phoned to thank the Sun, sent money for 25 copies "to send to different people who tried to find my dog for me. I thank you from the bottom of my heart". It was fortunate that she recovered the dog, even though it had died; she knows where Spunky went. -CI

EDITORIAL

BACK AREA THINKING OF FORMING NEW COUNTY!

For several weeks we have been hearing and reading about secession of the Mt. Empire from SD County and the formation of a new one. There have been talks and meetings in Alpine about incorporation. It apparently is still too small for that. But something has to be done about the many things that are annoying residents in the back country.

We pay high taxes with the rest of the county, yet we do not get nearly the service we should have. That means sheriff protection, health service, planning consideration and many other things.

As Dave Woodruff, editor of the Mt. Empire Chronicle, of Boulevard says: "Every day we hear of another taxpayer or property owner who is either denied the right to develop his property or business or to evacuate a residence on his property, even though it is conforming to county and state health requirements as to water and proper sewage".

He cited other instances, a couple being refused a license until they get a



special use permit for \$200, with no assurance it will be granted, nor the money refunded if not okayed.

Also in Jacumba a man was told he must form a water company if he wants to continue using his well water for a house and a trailer!

Woodruff points to his own case, refusal of a permit to build a small addition in the rear of his office for a print shop, because he is in the LC zoning ordinance as a non-conforming business, which nearly everyone in the back country is.

"But it still leaves these people with a piece of property on which they have no rights, but still having to pay taxes", he concludes.

In Alpine there is a glaring example. Floyd & Pat Naud, 605 Arnold Way, have had a trucking business since June, 1963. On Oct. 5, 1965, they bought the property under the impression that it was zoned to allow them to operate and maintain their trucks. On Oct. 8, 1969 they obtained a building permit to construct a workshop for their own vehicles. In December they received notice that they were in violation. Their only alteration is to apply for zone variance, for a \$200. fee plus, which was denied. The matter is being pursued.

This new county idea is really something to think about for there is indeed a deep rumbling in the back country. Alpine would like a nice county seat. -CI

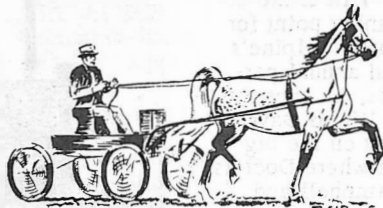

The little filly we sold her has worn her feet a bit so Bob will trim them in the hopes that it will correct the trouble.

TRIMMING THE HOOF

Whether a horse is shod or not, trimming the wall is very important to make sure that it will stay in good condition, should be started early in life, especially if any variation from normal growth is observed. Cutting hoofs at a young age, while the bones are still soft, will produce better results than at a later time when they are firmer. Trimming the feet of a young horse is almost like corrective shoeing since abnormal growth can be corrected over a longer period

of time. This will encourage uniform growth and prevent cracking and splitting of the hoof wall.

When the hoof breaks itself, it is not unusual for more to break away at one location than at another. When this happens, the result is uneven balance and nothing contributes more to unsoundness than an uneven foot.

Most horses should be trimmed every two months. Unshod colts may require the job done more often.

By caring for your colt's hoofs early it will make him much easier to handle later on and will give you a good chance to examine the foot for bruises or abnormal growth. The bottom should be cleaned every day with a pick and all trimming should be left to your horse-shoer.

If your horses feet become dry or brittle, they should be treated with a dressing which can be bought in any feed or western store. Never use one containing Vaseline or lanolin. A greasy hoof cannot absorb moisture and this will only make a dry condition worse. Treat the foot daily and be sure to cover it completely, frog, sole and coronet. Bob Alcorn, well known shoer in Alpine, told me to use plain old used motor oil which I did for years. By doing this, your horses feet should stay in perfect condition and keep him sound and ready to go.
