Christy-Anne Davis memorial scheduled

The campsites and hiking and bridle trails of San Diego County's backcountry provided the ideal venue for Christy-Anne Seiler Davis to indulge her love of nature.

An East County resident for more than 20 years, she enjoyed outings with her dog, Poncho, and fellow members of the Laguna Mountain Volunteer Association, an organization that helps with forest management.

For most of the past decade, Mrs. Davis, 42, lived in a remote area of Alpine, several miles off Interstate 8. She died in her home Oct. 26, a victim of the Cedar fire.

A celebration of life is scheduled for 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday in the Garden Room of the Bread Basket restaurant in Alpine.

As crews evacuated residents on her unpaved road the morning of the fire, Mrs. Davis pounded on a friend's door to awaken her. Mrs. Davis returned to her home, possibly to look for her keys, said her mother, Marcia Seiler-Christy.

"Her keys were found in her driveway, about 20 feet from

her truck," her mother said.

Mrs. Davis, a Seattle native, graduated from high school in Sacramento and moved to the San Diego area in 1979. For the past 1½ years, she had been employed in sales at American Rigging & Supply Co. in San Diego.

She attended Grossmont College, taking courses in business. She had been adding to college credits she previously accumulated at various schools, including San Diego State University.

"She was reorganizing her life, seeing what direction she should pursue," her mother said.

Survivors include her husband, Bruce of Lakeside; mother, Marcia Seiler-Christy of Spring Valley; father, Bob Seiler of Aurora, Colo.; sisters, Tracey Seiler of Spring Valley and Susan Seiler of Chula Vista; brother, Daniel Seiler of Chula Vista; stepdaughter, Vanessa Davis of Lemon Grove; stepson, Jeffrey Davis of Lemon Grove; stepmother, Judy Cauble of Aurora, Colo.; and stepfather, Jack Christy of Spring Valley.
