Then on Larkspur, Susan Lancaster. Other people close to us who have lost their home are the children and grandchildren of Crown Hills residents, Betty and Tom Seaman. Many have already asked about how they can help our friends and neighbors as they struggle to rebuild their homes and we have been busy setting up a system whereby you will be able to do just that. It was felt that gifts of money or gift certificates from WalMart, Target, Robinson's-May, Macy, Dixieline, or Home Depot would work best and would avoid duplication of items needed.
