Nickie and Robin helped us pack a few things. Ice plant on fence before fire—note later picture after fire. We left shortly after this picture was taken.


Ice plant doesn't look so pretty any more. Norman Rood shed left top lost except for shell—home saved, however. Home above and to their left both lost.
